Puppeteers of America 2019 National Puppetry Festival by Nancy Clark

On July 16 – 21 at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, 375 participants attended this festival. Approximately 100 artists performed puppet shows in mainstage performances, fringe presentations, the National Puppetry Slam, free outdoor community shows, and the Potpourri. On the mainstage, 20 national puppeteer companies and two international companies performed. Fifty-two workshops were offered plus three two-day intensive workshops and the Professional Day for Teaching Artists and Therapists. The workshops covered Building Techniques and Materials, Business and Marketing, Education -Teachers, Hands-On, Kid Appropriate, Making a Show (writing, directing, staging), Movement and Manipulation, Performance Techniques, and Technology. Also, there was a Festival Exhibit featuring select items from lifetime collector. Gary Busk. His collection is one of the largest-known private puppet collections in the United States. Thirty-four short puppet films had showings on various days. Needless to say, the Festival was jam packed with things to do. It is also a wonderful time to reunite with puppetry friends from far and wide. The Puppeteers of America National Festivals are held every other year, so the next one will be in 2021. Regional festivals are held in between, so look for them in 2020. I have had the privilege of attending multiple National and Regional Festivals and find it a highlight each time. Such puppet fun!










Drumm Farm Century Celebration by Kraig Kensinger

PAI is winding down a long collaboration with Drumm Farm Center for Children in Independence. Missouri. Andrew Drumm, a Kansas City businessman, opened a home for impoverished boys in 1919. The center has expanded over the years to provide extensive foster care and support services for families. As part of their "Century Celebration". PAI received a generous grant from the Beaudoin Family Foundation to offer puppetry arts events to the families and

Kraig Kensinger provided several lively marionette shows and demo workshops for monthly combined family dinner events. As part of their summer education program, PAI puppeteers shared presentations on puppets from around the world. Ann Ragan entertained with cowboy and Native American puppets as part of North America Day. As part of South America Day, Kathy Vest informed with puppets from Honduras, Spain and Mexico. For Africa Day, Anitra Steele charmed with animal puppet folk tales from Africa. The big finale was Drumm Farm's huge "Hoedown Festival" on Saturday October 12, 2019. PAI offered ongoing shows featuring country marionettes and a recital performed by an Andrew Drumm marionette made by the late Robert LeRoy Smith. This puppet was featured in a photo opt for the new Andrew Drumm biography book.
